Brandt, MD, MDiv, Professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at Tulane University School of Medicine, has been named the 2021 Olga Jonasson Distinguished Member Award with the Association of Women Surgeons Foundation. The award is given to an AWS member who, through outstanding mentorship, enables and encourages women surgeons to realize their personal and professional goals.

“I am incredibly honored to have been selected at this year's recipient of the AWS Olga Jonasson award,” said Brandt. “Dr. Jonasson was the first female chair of Surgery in the United States and to be in her company and the company of the women leaders who preceded me as awardees is truly humbling.”
