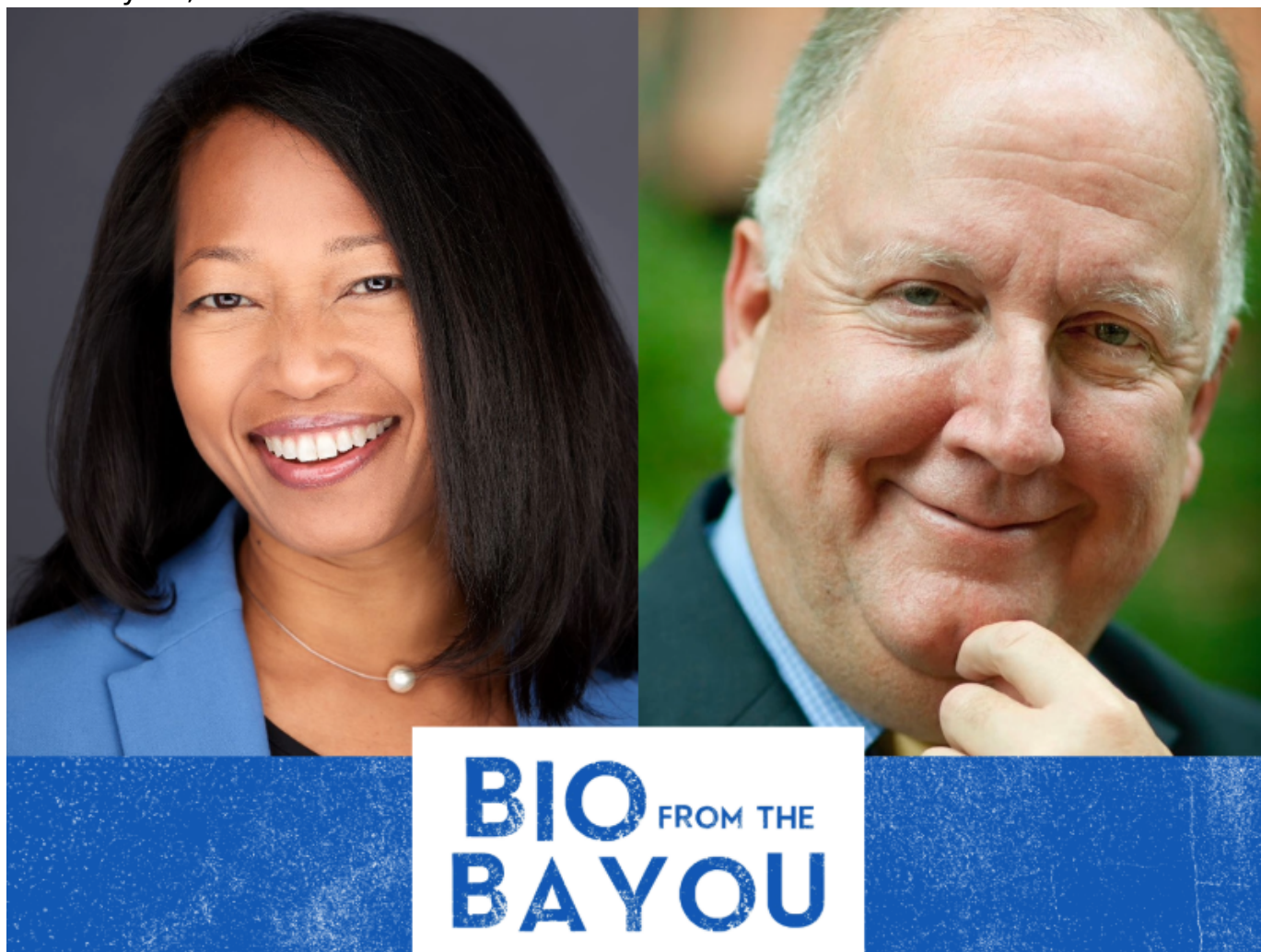


## [Listen and Learn: BIO from the BAYOU podcast unveils key insights for biotech success](#)
