Summary

In 1980, I joined the oldest colon and rectal group in southern Louisiana, started in the mid 1930's, and quickly became the managing partner. This CV is a brief but encyclopedic recitation of a long educational and professional career.

My year in England was a formative experience which warrants a more extensive description. Two of the major modern advances in Colorectal were of English origin in 1977-1978, one originating in Basingstoke and the other at St. Mark's Hospital in London.

The first was the use of circular surgical staplers that revolutionized the treatment of rectal cancer. This was two years before their commercial introduction by US Surgical. The original circular stapler was the Russian SPTU. Early in the academic year I spent a week with Professor John Goligher in Leeds who had the first one in England. R. J. Heald had the second and we began using it on my return from Leeds. Our work with the use of the stapler for rectal cancer led to Professor Heald's concept of total mesorectal excision, an equal revolution in the treatment for mid and low rectal cancer.

The second was the first presentation of the now standard restorative treatment for ulcerative colitis and familial polyposis, total proctocolectomy and ileal pouch-anal anastomsis. Sir Alan Parks at St. Mark's presented his initial series of 16 patients with an S-shaped ileal pouch, anal anastomosis.

The skills learned at the first introduction of these procedures were further honed by Fellowship at the University of Minnesota and became the basis for my practice.

Clinical Skills and Present Scope of Practice

Outpatient services range from an active office practice to endoscopies and anorectal surgery, focusing on common clinical problems such as hemorrhoids, fissures and fistulas extending to complicated fistulas and reconstructive anorectal surgery. Inpatient services cover diseases such as diverticulitis and colon cancer with a special interests in laparoscopy and the more complicated surgeries for rectal cancer and inflammatory bowel disease with over 1600 surgeries for Colorectal cancer and 350 reconstructive surgeries for ulcerative colitis and familial polyposis. The practice draws from an area from the Texas- Louisiana border in the west to Pensacola in the east with occasional patients from the Midwest and Canada.
