

Tulane University School of Medicine An Update FOR HEALTHCARE WORKERS to the 12/29/21 COVID-19 Guidelines January 5, 2022

SoM Health Care Providers:

Effective immediately, the School of Medicine will NOT require Health Care Providers/Workers with COVID-19 who are asymptomatic or mildly symptomatic to have a negative COVID test in order to return to work after 5 days. This is a change from the <u>COVID-19 guidelines distributed on</u> <u>December 29, 2021</u>. This new guideline is as below.

HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS/WORKERS (HCP)

- Return to Work from COVID-19 Infection
 - A Health Care Provider with COVID-19 who is asymptomatic or mildly symptomatic can return to work after 5 days *without* a negative test, if
 - At least 5 days have passed since symptoms first appeared, or positive test, if asymptomatic (day 0), and
 - At least 24 hours have passed since last fever without the use of feverreducing medications and
 - Symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath) have improved.
 - After returning to work, HCP should wear a N95 or KN95 mask for at least 5 days
 - If the mask must be removed, for example, to eat or drink, the provider should isolate from others
 - Self-monitor for symptoms and seek re-evaluation from occupational health if symptoms recur or worsen

The remainder of the <u>Guidelines distributed on December 29, 2021</u> remain in effect.
