

# Early Childhood System Integration Budget

For FY 2010 – Revised through June 25, 2010

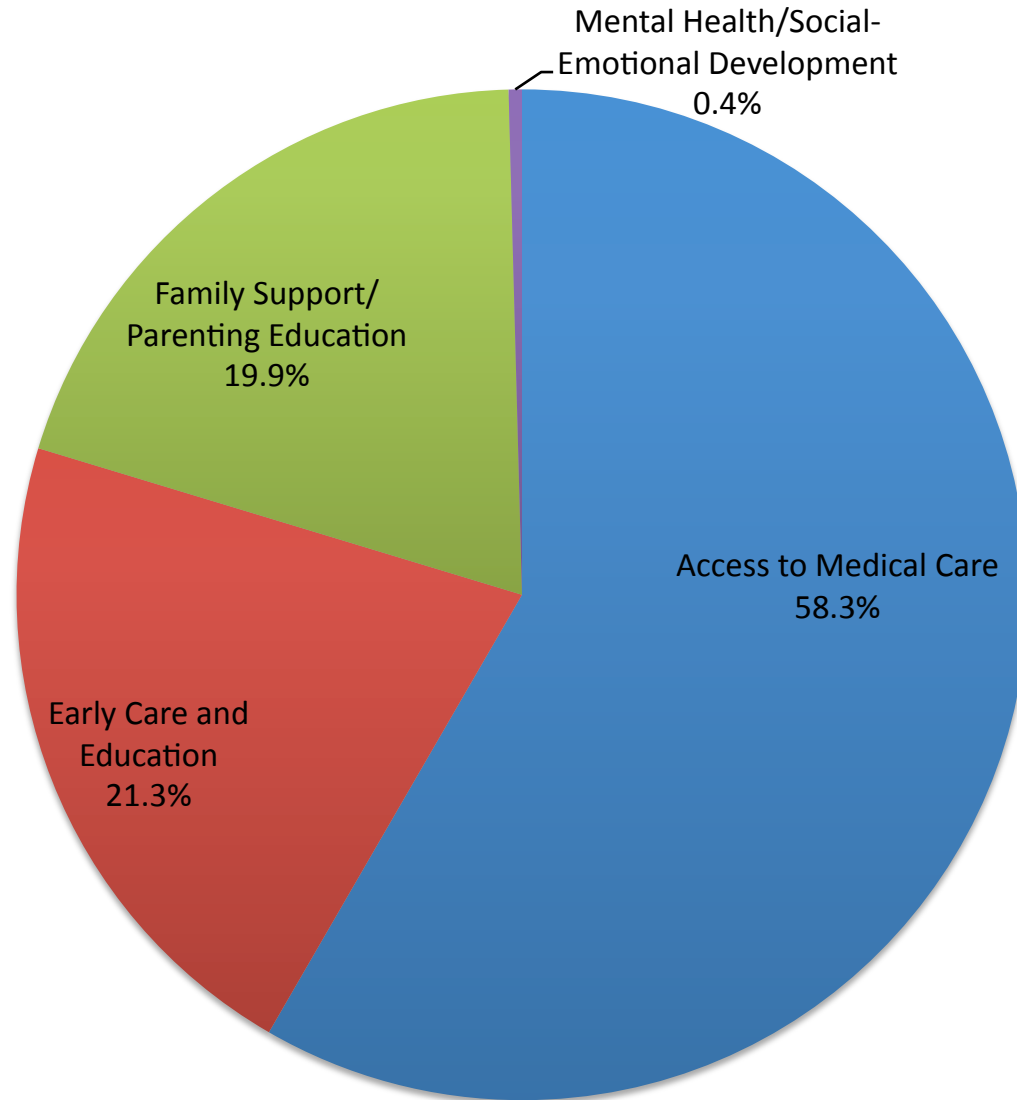
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The Early Childhood System Integration Budget (ECSIB) was created by Act 774 of the 2008 Regular Session of the Louisiana Legislature. The ECSIB is organized along the original four components of Louisiana's early childhood system (access to medical care, social-emotional development and mental health, early care and education, and family support and parenting education) as opposed to by department, thus detailing the state's allocation of financial resources for children ages birth to five in these areas. Within these four areas, each department categorizes program specific information, including the lead contact person, a very brief program description, the population served, the sources of funding for the program, and the parishes being served. For each line item, actual state and federal dollars invested in the program are detailed.
