

Tulane working on test to predict COVID-19 complications



Could some of those who died from COVID-19 and other infectious diseases have been saved by a diagnosis that predicts how severe their cases will be and provides timelier treatment?

An interdisciplinary team of Tulane engineers and doctors including **Dahlene Fusco, MD**, and **Arnaud Drouin, MD**, hopes to answer that question with the development of new technology designed to detect severe COVID complications such as thrombosis, a condition in which blood clots block veins and arteries. <u>Read more about the research here.</u>
